The Selection Committee will evaluate the applicant's ability to pursue successfully the course using the following criteria -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• an undergraduate degree with at least 50 credit points at second or third year level in a cognate discipline with a grade average of at least H2B (70%) in these subjects , or equivalent; or</li><li>• a Graduate Diploma in a relevant area of study with a grade average of at least H2B, or equivalent; or</li><li>• a Graduate Certificate in a relevant area of study with a grade average of at least H2B (70%) and at least one year of full time documented relevant work experience, or equivalent.</li></ul> <p>2. The Selection Committee may conduct interviews or tests and may call for referee reports and employer references to elucidate any of the matters referred to above.</p>
