Assessment:	Work-in-progress paper, assessed by Subject Coordinator (20%). Written project, suitable for publication, of 5,000-10,000 words, to be assessed by an independent examiner (80%). Students must pass the written report assessment and must receive a combined score for the research report and progress report of at least 50% in order to pass the subject.
