Students will assess BrechtÃ,s contribution to modern drama, political theatre and contemporary theatre practice through lectures, readings, seminars and practical workshops.
Assessment:	A total of 4000 words. An essay of 3000 words 50% (due at the end of semester), class exercises of 1000 words including performances 40% and participation including preparation for practical work 10%.
