An honours grade of at least H2B (70%) average must be attained in the respective thesis and advanced seminar components of the course to qualify for the award of the masters degree.		
Objectives:	Students who complete the masters will: # understand modern critical frameworks for the study of visual and material cultures; # acquire skills in the analysis of objects; develop the ability to analyse primary historical and contemporary source material; # gain an understanding of the critical reception of works of art; # prepare an original piece of research; # develop and sustain an argument based upon that research; # develop a knowledge and understanding of research techniques.
