Subject Overview:	In this subject students will learn to translate from Chinese to English and English to Chinese. The selection of texts will be limited to modern literature and to documents and news items on politics and international affairs. In their translations students will learn to focus on accuracy as well as stylistic appropriateness and will be encouraged to submit both individual and group work.
Objectives:	# acquire skills to explicate complex materials written in another language. # be able to present complex information accurately and fluently in writing. # appreciate the complexity of translating concepts from one system into another.
Assessment:	One written translation totalling 1500 words 40% (due at the end of the semester), a 2-hour examination 50% (due during the examination period) and continuous class participation 10%. Class attendance is required for this subject; if you do not attend a minimum of 80% of classes without an approved exemption you will not be eligible for a pass in this subject. Assessment submitted late without an approved extension will be penalised at 10% per day. In-class tasks missed without approval will not be marked. All pieces of written work must be submitted to pass this subject.
