Assessment:	A 10-minute class paper in Italian 25% (due during the semester) an essay of 2000 words for 3rd year and 2500 words for 4th year 50% (due after the end of the subject) and a 1-hour final written test 25% (due during exam period). This subject has the following hurdle requirements: Regular participation in tutorials is required with a minimum of 75% attendance. All pieces of written work must be submitted to pass this subject. Assessment submitted late without an approved extension will be penalised at 10% per day and in-class tasks missed without approval will not be marked.
