A separate Faculty of Commerce was established in 1924. In 1944 it was renamed the Faculty of Business and Economics.</p> <p>To complete an economics major in the BA, a student must meet the mathematics prerequisite of a score of at least 25 in VCE Mathematical Methods, or equivalent.</p>
