Overview:	Russian language subjects are organised in a progressive sequence (of units) from Russian 1 through to Russian 6. While students taking the major will normally enter at Russian 1, entry and exit points are determined by the student's background in the language, placement testing, prerequisites, or at the discretion of the Russian program. Students normally progress through the subjects in consecutive order. Mid-year entry is also possible into subjects with even numbers, subject to appropriate prior experience and approval from the head of the Russian program. Accelerated progression is possible on advice from the Russian Program.

	integrity and the ethics of scholarship; # Appreciate Russian-speaking cultures in a differentiated	d and informed way;	
	# Engage critically and to constructively in intercultural dialogue as a bicultural and biling person and as a global citizen; # Independently apply a wide range of learning techniques (in Russian and English) as autonomous, motivated, self-directed and well-organised learners; # Act confidently in Russian-speaking milieus and target culture, and work effectively in a cooperative way using Russian and English as media.		
Structure & Available	Russian		
Subjects:	A 100-point major and 75-point minor sequence is available. The sequence is as follows for Major and Minor: # Russian 1 entry point: for students who have very little or no knowledge of Russian. Students will have their appropriate entry point determined by the Russian Program, based of evidence of prior learning and/or results of a placement test as required. 	Students completing a major in Russian will usually undertake 25 points at level one, 37.5 points at level two and 37.5 points at level three. Students completing a minor will usually undertake 25 points at level one, 25 points at level two and 25 points at level three.
