| Assessment: | A research essay of 4000 words in Hebrew or English on a prescribed topic in consultation with the co-ordinator, due at the end of semester (100%) Hurdle Requirement: students must attend a minimum of 75% of organised supervisions in order to pass this subject all pieces of written work must be submitted to pass this subject Note: Assessment submitted late without an approved extension will be penalised at 10% per day. After five working days late assessment will not be marked. In-class tasks missed without approval will not be marked. |
