<b>Subject Overview:</b>	Walter Benjamin called Paris the capital of the 19th century. This subject examines some of the ways in which Paris was a centre for musical activity in the 19th century. It looks at the importance of music criticism, music societies, theatres/companies and exhibitions. Repertoire is examined from within social and cultural contexts.
<b>Learning Outcomes:</b>	<p>On completion of this subject students should have developed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• a capacity for independent critical thought</li> <li>• high level cognitive skills</li> <li>• an openness to new ideas</li> <li>• knowledge, skills and practices, which provide a basis for independent critical inquiry and research-based writing.</li> </ul>
<b>Assessment:</b>	Essay 2,500 words (60%); listening test of one hour (35%); attendance and participation in class 5%.
