Activities include analysis of data, policy analysis, a small evaluation of a health program, a small qualitative research study, a systematic or narrative review of the literature, or the development of a research protocol. Some activities are only available in specific streams of the course. Students enrolling in the year-long project MUST complete the project in two semesters consecutively.
Learning Outcomes:	Upon completion of this subject, students should have demonstrated their ability to: # critically appraise the existing research evidence in a specific area # formulate a research question based upon a synthesis of the existing research evidence # design and justify an appropriate research method to answer the research question # conduct or evaluate research in a specific area and summarise, analyse and interpret research findings # Communicate research effectively and appropriately in oral and written form to an audience. # Reflect on the research process undertaken and the opportunity for future improvements
