A maximum of two ESL units may be credited towards the Graduate Diploma in Arts (English Language). Students may enrol in ESL subjects before sitting a placement test. However, final placement will depend on results of the DELA diagnostic test or an interview with ESL staff. Students who are native speakers of English, or who have a comparable level of competency, are not eligible to enrol. Students should sit the DELA which is run during the week before the start of Semester.</p>
