Students will gain considerable knowledge in an area of Chinese studies and engage in advanced level language study while undertaking critical assessment of related issues. The Selection Committee will evaluate the applicant's ability to pursue successfully the course using the following criterion –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • an undergraduate degree with a major in Chinese (100 credit points or 125 credit points for the beginners stream) or a cognate discipline with a grade average of at least H2B 70% in the major, or equivalent; <p>2. The Selection Committee may conduct interviews or tests and may call for referee reports and employer references to elucidate any of the matters referred to above.</p>
