Subject Overview:	In this subject students will consolidate the skills developed in 110-079 Indonesian Level 4A. Students should be able to read Indonesian texts of different styles and registers, and to write a fairly nuanced essay in formal Indonesian, demonstrating sensitivity to the complexity of Indonesian social life and language.
Assessment:	Class participation 10% (ongoing); oral presentation for class discussion on assigned reading materials 10% (during the semester); a written test in class of 500 words 10% (mid-semester); speech of 10 minutes 10% (mid-semester), long essay 1000 words 20% (near end of semester); and 2-hour written final examination 40% (examination period). Second and third-year students are required to attend a minimum of 80% of all classes in order to be eligible to take the examination.
