| Subject Overview: | In this subject students should develop their ability to read, discuss and write in Indonesian about social, political, cultural and historical phenomena in Indonesia and the world. Oral and colloquial language will be made more familiar and discussion on grammar will be conducted at an advanced level. |
| Assessment: | Two essays of 1500 words, 35% each (due mid-semester and during the examination period), a 10-minute oral examination 20% (due end of semester) and class participation 10% (throughout the semester). |
