Subject Overview:	This subject introduces advanced learners of Japanese to two interrelated, but different, areas of language study: translation and interpreting. It provides the students with opportunities to understand and gain knowledge necessary for interpreting and translating. It involves the practice of interpreting and text translation in various settings and contexts. Students are also encouraged to explore the differences and similarities in various aspects of Japanese and English.
Assessment:	Written/oral work totalling 2000 words 50% (due throughout the semester) and a final examination 50% (due during the examination period)
Prescribed Texts:	Materials supplied by the Institute.
Recommended Texts:	.
Breadth Options:	This subject is a level 2 or level 3 subject and is not available to new generation degree students as a breadth option in 2008. This subject or an equivalent will be available as breadth in the future.
