<b>Subject Overview:</b>	This subject has two main aims: (1) to help students transfer their adult reading skills from their native language to French, and to enable students to develop effective and appropriate reading strategies such that they become independent and successful readers; (2) to build on and further enhance the skills developed in semester 1, on knowledge about aspects of recent French history acquired in the reading skills part of the subject.
<b>Assessment:</b>	In semester class exercises 50%, a 500 word assignment 30% (due in semester) and an end of semester exam 20%.
