Subject Overview:	This subject is designed to provide students with an analytical and comprehensive understanding of Italian usage. Topics will vary, and may include contrastive analysis of English and Italian, varieties of Italian, dialects, geographical variation, history of the Italian language, topics in applied linguistics. This subject is both descriptive and practical and is intended to give students a better understanding of Italian in its many contexts.
Assessment:	A 1-hour written class test of 1000 words 30% (due mid-semester), a take home assignment totalling 1000 words for 3rd year and 2000 words for 4th year 30% (due at the end of semester), a 1-hour exam of 1000 words 30% (due at the end of semester) and a 5-minute oral, totalling 1000 words 10% (due at the end of semester).
