Subject Overview:	This subject uses authentic written and audio-visual texts to expand students' ability to understand, speak and write German. Students should achieve the level of competency required for admittance into 126-021 German Post-Intermediate 3A.
Assessment:	A 2-hour examination 40% (during examinations period), two listening tests equivalent to 500 words 10% (mid and end of semester), written work equivalent to 1000 words 30% (during semester), a 5-minute oral presentation equivalent to 250 words 10% (during semester) and vocabulary tests equivalent to 250 words 10% (during semester).
