<b>Subject Overview:</b>	This Public History subject offers students the opportunity to study Chinese-Australian history, the broader field of Chinese diaspora studies, and to apply this knowledge in historical research on Chinese heritage sites and material culture in Victoria. Students will participate in the Victorian research programme of the Chinese Australian Cultural Heritage (CACH) Project, an Australian Heritage Commission initiative, in collaboration with the Cultural Heritage Unit (in the Department of History) and Heritage Victoria (State Government).
