<b>Subject Overview:</b>	The content of this subject is individually negotiated between the student and a supervisor appointed by the subject co-ordinator, on the basis of the academic areas of expertise of the available supervisors, and the interests of the student. A list of available supervisors and their nominated fields of study is available from the subject co-ordinator. This subject functions to provide students with the opportunity to do supervised work on a particular topic area which is not covered in depth in other subjects. The assessment includes a literature review or annotated bibliography, and an essay. The exact form of the work will be negotiated between student and supervisor.
<b>Assessment:</b>	Annotated bibliography of approximately 1,000 words, due mid semester (30%); Essay of approximately 3,000 words due at end of semester (70%).
