Students may be required to write regular reports on the progress of their research. By the end of the second year of candidature, students should have a research proposal prepared and the major part of the research and structural planning of the thesis would normally be completed by the end of the third year of candidature. The thesis topic must be based on the student's performance interests and specialisations and approved by the Graduate Studies Committee. The thesis should be presented as a study of 10-15,000 words (excluding footnotes and appendices) embodying the results of significant research to a standard equivalent to a Master's research thesis.
Assessment:	Two bound, word-processed copies of the thesis are to be submitted for examination by the date set by the end of December in the third year of candidacy. Candidates must follow the Faculty style guidelines as set out for research projects.
