Students are encouraged to be independent thinkers and emancipated art makers with enhanced (and sometimes new) competencies.
Assessment:	Semester 1 & 2 Continuous: participation in seminars (10%). Formal: A lecture/demonstration of 45 minutes approximately followed by group discussion (one per semester) (90%).
