Course Overview:	<p>This course enables holders of the Diploma of Dramatic Art (VCA) to convert their qualification into a Bachelor of Dramatic Art (VCA). Students would need to complete units of study comprising 50 points. These units may include a Portfolio of Professional Experience; Special Projects and units from other VCA courses.</p> <p>Students need to complete units of study comprising 50 points in order to qualify for the Bachelor of Dramatic Art (Acting). Thus a student can enrol for 6 months full-time or one-year part-time. There are two alternative pathways</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # Graduates who have pursued a full professional career in their chosen art form since graduating; # Graduates who have spent some time in the profession but have now moved into a different area. <p>Professional Pathway: Students who can demonstrate documentary evidence of continued high level performance in the field may take:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # 757 Professional Experience Portfolio 50 points <p>Standard Pathway: Students must acquire points through a selection from the following:</p> <p>757-338 Performance Project 50 points 757-339 Course Work Study 25 points 757-340 Special Project (off campus) 25 points</p> <p>A student may elect to do two special projects of 25 points or units amounting to 50 points.</p>																	
Objectives:	If a student is to take out the current degree, it is essential that she/he demonstrates the ability to work in a sustained way at a level appropriate to the final year of the degree as it is now. The Victorian College of the Arts therefore considers it appropriate that a student coming into the Bachelor of Dramatic Art with the diploma should acquire another 50 points of final year study.
