<b>Overview:</b>	<p>The prerequisites for entry to fourth-year honours in political science are completion of all the requirements for the BA, completion of a major in political science and an average grade over the second/third year subjects within the major equivalent to at least an H2A (75%).</p> <p><b>Students undertaking pure honours in political science complete:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># Political Science Thesis (37.5 points); and</li> <li># Five honours subjects in political science (totalling 62.5 points), including <i>Social Science Research Seminar</i></li> </ul> <p><b>Students undertaking combined honours in political science complete:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># Political Science Thesis (37.5 points); and</li> <li># Two honours subjects in political science (totalling 25 points), including Social Science Research Seminar ; and</li> <li># Three honours subjects in the combining program (totalling 37.5 points).</li> </ul> <p>or</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># Honours thesis in the combining program (37.5 points); and</li> <li># Two honours subjects in the combining program (totalling 25 points); and</li> <li># Three honours subjects in political science (totalling 37.5 points).</li> </ul>
