<b>Subject Overview:</b>	This subject asks students to develop their own non-fiction writing, short or longer, through the study of course materials, through class discussions, workshop sessions and submission of draft material. The topics dealt with in this subject will include sport, travel, political and autobiographical writing. The subject enables students to develop and draft a number of related or unrelated essays and other creative non-fictions, and to gain an understanding of the writing workshop process.
<b>Objectives:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># have developed and drafted a number of related or unrelated essays and other non-fictions;</li> <li># have developed an understanding of the writing workshop process and the opportunities for writing development it offers;</li> <li># have developed an understanding of the processes and choices involved in their own creative writing;</li> <li># have developed an awareness of the way in which the material presentaiton of writing is significant.</li> </ul>
<b>Assessment:</b>	Written work totalling 4000 words comprising two pieces of writing 90% (due at the end of semester) and class participation 10%.
<b>Prescribed Texts:</b>	A subject reader will be available.
