Assessment:	Oral and listening comprehension class work 20% (due weekly in class); a 10-minute oral examination 15% (during the examination period); a 30-minute listening test 15% (at the end of semester); homework and writing tests 10% (weekly in class); a 2-hour final examination 40% (during the examination period)
