Subject Overview:	In this subject students will learn to translate from Chinese to English and English to Chinese. The selection of texts will be limited to modern literature and to documents and news items on politics and international affairs. In their translations students will learn to focus on accuracy as well as stylistic appropriateness and will be encouraged to submit both individual and group work.
Objectives:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> # acquire skills to explicate complex materials written in another language; # be able to present complex information accurately and fluently in writing; # appreciate the complexity of translating concepts from one system into another.
Assessment:	Class work totalling 500 words 20% (due weekly in class), written translations totalling 1500 words 40% (due at intervals during semester) and a 2-hour examination 40% (due during the examination period).
