The program must demonstrate: availability of expertise within FLFR or from the wine industry to provide guidance to the student, feasibility of the study within the constraints of resources and time, necessity of the study to the student's overall academic objectives, limits of the study in topics and depth of study, industry input necessary to complete the study, the level of academic rigor is appropriate to graduate diploma level, and methods of assessment.
