<b>Objectives:</b>	<p>Students who have completed the Master of Modern Languages Education course should be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># demonstrate a high level of competence in the management and teaching of at least one modern language;</li> <li># demonstrate a superior knowledge and understanding of the theory and practice of language learning;</li> <li># have an understanding of the theory and practice of research in modern languages education;</li> <li># make effective use of the findings of educational writings and research in addressing language education-related professional problems;</li> <li># have the depth of knowledge and understanding that will enable them to be a resource for colleagues in language education-related professional situations.</li> </ul>

<b>Entry Requirements:</b>	An applicant may be eligible for entry into the Master of Modern Languages Education, Stream 100B, if the applicant has: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># an appropriate four year degree comprising approved modern language and modern languages methodology studies and at least two years of documented relevant work experience, or</li> <li># a three year degree and Graduate Diploma in Education comprising modern languages methodology studies and at least two years of documented relevant work experience, or</li> <li># the Postgraduate Certificate in Modern Languages Education</li> </ul>
