<b>Subject Overview:</b>	<p>This subject consists of 23 days practicum which has been divided into two components. The first component is a 15 day placement in an approved special education inclusive setting. The student will have the opportunity to observe and participate in teaching practices; work with existing Learning Support Plans; conduct informal assessment methods; to work within a multi-disciplinary and transdisciplinary team; design individual learning experiences for preschoolers and students. The second component is a series of 8 professional enhancement workshops to be conducted by the university staff. These workshops will be held during class time of academic subjects which are designed to support and prepare students for their professional practice experience.</p>
<b>Objectives:</b>	<p>On completion of this subject, students should be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># Demonstrate an ability to apply and implement the theoretical constructs in the course to the assessment, planning, implementation of learning and teaching programs for preschoolers and students who have a disability</li> <li># Demonstrate the ability to contribute sequential ordered teaching to overall family support plans program support groups and instruction in a team context</li> <li># Demonstrate an increasing ability to evaluate the efficacy of individual programs for children with a range of needs</li> <li># Articulate information about children to team members</li> <li># Demonstrate cultural sensitivity and understanding when interacting with parents</li> </ul>
