<b>Subject Overview:</b>	Orientation to the placement facility; observation of client needs and programs; graded introduction to assessment of client needs; implementation of music therapy programs, evaluation and reporting (verbatim and written).
<b>Objectives:</b>	On completion of this subject students should be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># adapt learned music therapy skills to various client populations;</li> <li># identify and apply appropriate ethical standards of practice;</li> <li># access research literature using IT resources and print journals;</li> <li># work as an informed team-member within the multidisciplinary team in special education and clinical settings; and</li> <li># construct a clinical report using accepted research guidelines.</li> </ul>
<b>Assessment:</b>	A written report of 3000 words, comprising either a case study or a group project due at the end of the semester (70%); clinical training assessment due at the end of the semester (30%). A pass must be achieved on clinical training assessment in order to pass the subject.
