It also provides an opportunity to perform a comprehensive and supervised dissection (and surgical procedures) on a cadaver.</p> <p>The course is quality assured by the University of Melbourne and conducted by expert academic staff from the Department of Anatomy and Cell Biology at the University of Melbourne.</p>
