Structure & Available Subjects:	<p>Students undertaking pure honours in socio-legal studies must complete:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # Thesis (37.5 points); # Social Science Research Seminar (12.5 points); # One Core Methods subject (12.5 points);and # 37.5 points of elective subjects. <p>Students undertaking combined honours in socio-legal studies must complete:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # Thesis (37.5 points); # Social Science Research Seminar (12.5 points); # One Core Methods subject (12.5 points) # 3 subjects in the combining discipline (37.5 points) <p>OR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # Thesis in combining discipline (37.5 points); # Two subjects in combining discipline (25 points); # One Core Methods subject (12.5 points); and # 25 points of Socio-Legal Studies elective subjects. <p>Total 100 points</p>
