Structure & Available Subjects:	<p>Students undertaking pure honours in English must complete:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # English Thesis (37.5 points); # Research Principles and Practices (12.5 points); and # four honours subjects in English (50 points). <p>Students undertaking combined honours in English and another discipline must complete:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # English Thesis (37.5 points); # Research Principles and Practices (12.5 points); # one honours subject in English (12.5 points);and # three honours subjects in the combining program (37.5 points). <p>or</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # Honours thesis in the combining program (37.5 points); # two honours subjects in the combining program (25 points); and # three honours subjects in English (37.5 points), <i>excluding</i> Research Principles and Practices. <p>Total 100 points</p>
