<b>Structure &amp; Available Subjects:</b>	<p>A major in development usually consists of eight 12.5-point subjects, totalling 100 points. It comprises:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># two first-year subjects (25 points), which must include Famine in the Modern World and at least one other subject from the list of first-year social science subjects below; and</li> <li># six second/third-year subjects (75 points), which must include Development and the Third World, three core subjects and two optional subjects.</li> </ul> <p>Students seeking to make a career in development are strongly advised to construct an undergraduate program that combines a major in development with a major in one of the social sciences (anthropology, economics, geography, political science, sociology).</p> <p>Students who commenced their degree before 2007 will need to complete 112.5 points toward this major in order to complete the major.
