<b>Subject Overview:</b>	The Symphonic Wind Ensemble was established over 20 years ago and was one of the first outside of the military bands. The ensemble covers a wide range of repertoire, offers solo opportunities to music students and recognises the importance of the wind ensemble genre in education and professional development.
<b>Objectives:</b>	On completion of this subject students should be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># Show technical development as ensemble musicians</li> <li># Participate with ability and self-confidence as a team member of a performing group</li> <li># Perform selected repertoire to concert standard</li> <li># Identify and exhibit specific knowledge of a range of ensemble repertoire</li> <li># exhibit an informed respect for the values and principles of ensemble performance</li> </ul>
<b>Assessment:</b>	Assessment will be on a pass/fail basis and will be based on preparation of parts, individual and/or sectional practice and active participation in all rehearsals, classes and performances as directed (75%); attendance and submission of a concert report of three appropriate concerts (500 words each, due weeks 4, 8 and 12) (25%). Less than 80% attendance will result in a fail. All assessment components must be passed in order to pass the subject, including the timely, satisfactory completion of all three concert reports.
