<b>Subject Overview:</b>	This course will further enhance students' knowledge of vocabulary, the basic grammar of spoken Chinese, and reading, writing and oral/aural skills.
<b>Objectives:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># have mastered the basic grammatical structures of Modern Chinese;</li> <li># have a vocabulary of approximately 1000 characters;</li> <li># have sufficient listening and spoken skills to cope with everyday situations in China;</li> <li># acquire skills to use written materials to acquire systematic competence in a communicative code;</li> <li># be able to time manage and regularly invest effort as the foundation for advanced levels of competence;</li> <li># and develop cross-cultural communication skills.</li> </ul>
<b>Assessment:</b>	A 1-hour examination 30% (during the examination period), a 30-minute listening comprehension test 20% (during the examination period), a 10-minute oral test 20% (during the examination period), fortnightly tests 10%, a composition test 10% (at the end of semester) and class participation 10%.
<b>Prescribed Texts:</b>	As for Chinese 1A.
