<b>Structure &amp; Available Subjects:</b>	<p><b>Students undertaking pure honours in criminology must complete:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># Criminology Thesis (37.5 points)</li> <li># One Compulsory subject (12.5 points)</li> <li># One Core Methods subject (12.5 points) and</li> <li># 37.5 points of elective subjects</li> </ul> <p><b>Students undertaking combined honours in criminology and another program must complete:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># Criminology Thesis (37.5 points);</li> <li># One Compulsory subject (12.5 points)</li> <li># One Core Methods subject (12.5 points) and</li> <li># Three subjects in the combining discipline (37.5 points).</li> </ul> <p>or</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># Thesis in the combining discipline (37.5 points); and</li> <li># Two subjects in the combining discipline (25 points);</li> <li># One core methods subject (12.5 points); and</li> <li># 25 points of Criminology elective subjects.</li> </ul> <p>Total 100 points</p>
