It comprises:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # one first-year subject in any area of study (12.5 points); and # a minimum of five second/third-year subjects (62.5 points) from the list of core subjects; and # the remainder from the list of core or optional subjects. <p>Students who commenced their degree before 2007 will need to complete 112.5 points toward this major in order to complete the major.
