It comprises:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # two first-year subjects (25 points); and # two second-year level subjects (25 points); and # four third-year level subjects (50 points). <p>Only the subjects listed below are available to Bachelor of Arts students undertaking a theatre studies major.</p> <p>Students who commenced their degree before 2007 will need to complete 112.5 points in order to complete the major.
