<b>Objectives:</b>	<p>Students who complete the postgraduate diploma should:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># complete the equivalent of a four year BA (Honours) degree with a research component and obtain a recognised qualification;</li> <li># gain an adequate basis for pursuing advanced studies in linguistics and applied linguistics at Masters or PhD level;</li> <li># demonstrate a specialist understanding of specific areas of study, showing an understanding of the latest research directions;</li> <li># develop a capacity for an advanced level of analysis in relation to the specific issues in linguistics and applied linguistics.</li> </ul>												
<b>Structure &amp; Available Subjects:</b>	<p>The Postgraduate Diploma in Arts in this area of specialisation requires:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># Thesis 12,000 words (37.5 points)</li> <li># one compulsory subject (12.5 points)</li> <li># elective subjects (50 points)</li> </ul> <p>Total 100 points - subjects are 12.5 points each, unless indicated otherwise.</p>
