Topics covered will be selected from integrating computers into classroom activities; planning for IT use for schools and classrooms; management of IT resources (including budgeting); and IT strategic planning for schools.
Objectives:	On completion of this subject students will have demonstrated that they can work in both teams and individually to analyse and evaluate ICT needs of classrooms and schools, to determine goals for the classroom or school, and create plans to achieve these goals.
