Course Overview:	<p>The Specialist Certificate is designed for senior physiotherapists who specialise in paediatrics or musculoskeletal practice.</p> <p>The Specialist Certificate provides preparation for the physiotherapist to function in an advanced clinical role in paediatric orthopaedics (with the support of a paediatric orthopaedic consultant as needed).</p> <p>The intent is that the certificate will provide physiotherapists with an opportunity to develop competencies associated with advanced physiotherapy practice in the outpatient setting.</p>											
Objectives:	<p>The course aims to enable participants to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • acquire the knowledge, skills, attitudes and values necessary for the development of the advanced physiotherapist role in paediatric orthopaedics in the outpatient setting. • understand and apply advanced clinical reasoning skills and an evidence-based approach to decision making • develop a high level of oral and written communication skills • gain an understanding of the changing knowledge base in the specialist area • facilitate the development, implementation and undertaking of new and innovative practices within legislative and professional boundaries • recognise the knowledge, skills, and attitudes required for effective team functioning • develop the leadership, team work relevant to advanced practitioners

The Selection Committee may conduct interviews and tests and may call for referee reports or employer references to elucidate any of the matters referred to above.</p>
