<b>Subject Overview:</b>	This subject continues development of the ability to speak, read, write and understand Indonesian begun in Indonesian Level 1A. Students should achieve a basic communicative competence in Indonesian. develop a sound basis in grammar and vocabulary for further Indonesian language study. and further their understanding of Indonesian culture.
<b>Objectives:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># have achieved basic communicative competence in Indonesian with an emphasis on aural/ oral competence.</li> <li># have developed a sound basis for further Indonesian language study.</li> <li># have developed "Asia-literacy" and an empathy with Indonesian people and culture.</li> <li># acquire skills to put theoretical knowledge to active use.</li> <li># acquire skills to communicate actively in an unfamiliar environment using restricted resources.</li> <li># be able to interact practically in a social and cultural environment different from one's own.</li> </ul>
<b>Assessment:</b>	Written work and class tests totalling 1500 words 60% (throughout the semester), a 2-hour written examination 30% and a short oral examination 10% (due during the examination period).Class attendance is required for this subject; if you do not attend a minimum of 80% of classes without an approved exemption you will not be eligible for a pass in this subject. Assessment submitted late without an approved extension will be penalised at 10% per day. In-class tasks missed without approval will not be marked. All pieces of written work must be submitted to pass this subject.
