<b>Subject Overview:</b>	This is an advanced subject in which students learn to discuss, read and write with confidence about a wide variety of topics in Indonesian. Indonesian reading materials include a variety of short literary texts and articles about current events in Indonesia.
<b>Objectives:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># be able to discuss, read and write with confidence about a wide variety of topics.</li> <li># have read in Indonesian a variety of short literary texts and articles about current events in Indonesia.</li> <li># acquire the skills to present argument and analysis in a foreign language.</li> <li># learn to use Indonesian as a means for abstract thinking.</li> <li># learn about contemporary political, social, cultural and historical phenomena and learn to discuss these with confidence.</li> </ul>
<b>Assessment:</b>	A 2-hour examination 40% (due during the examination period), a 10-minute oral examination 10% (due during the examination period), a 1.5 hour test (due mid-semester) 20%, a 1000-word summary (due late semester) 20% and continuous class participation 10%. Class attendance is required for this subject; if you do not attend a minimum of 80% of classes without an approved exemption you will not be eligible for a pass in this subject. Assessment submitted late without an approved extension will be penalised at 10% per day. In-class tasks missed without approval will not be marked. All pieces of written work must be submitted to pass this subject.
