<b>Subject Overview:</b>	This is a small chamber choir of 12–20 members that performs music of the middle ages, renaissance and baroque. The ensemble performs both a cappella and also in conjunction with other early music ensembles.
<b>Objectives:</b>	On completion of this subject students should be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li># show technical development as ensemble musicians</li> <li># participate with ability and self-confidence as a team member of a performing group</li> <li># perform selected repertoire to concert standard</li> <li># identify and exhibit specific knowledge of a range of ensemble repertoire</li> <li># exhibit an informed respect for the values and principles of ensemble performance.</li> </ul>
<b>Assessment:</b>	Assessment will be on a pass/fail basis and will be based on preparation of parts, individual and/or sectional practice and active participation in all rehearsals, classes and performances as directed (75%); 3 web-based multiple choice tests, based on assigned reading, relevant to the experience of music performance, in week 4, 8 and 12 (25%). Less than 80% attendance will result in a fail. All assessment components must be passed in order to pass the subject.
<b>Prescribed Texts:</b>	A reading pack will be available for purchase from the Bookroom at the start of semester.
