Subject Overview:	This subject continues to focus on the acquisition of Spanish through a communicative approach to language learning but on a more advanced level than Spanish Beginners 1A. The students engage with more complex texts and a wider range of structures and vocabulary. Students will continue to encounter cultural aspects of the Hispanic world which are regularly presented in the language classes. This subject enables students to interact in Spanish using some past tenses in everyday situations.						
Objectives:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> # have improved their spoken, reading comprehension and written Spanish skills to a good basic level. # be able to interact confidently with native speakers of Spanish. 						
Assessment:	Continuous aural, oral and written assessment 50% (2,000 words). final written examination of 2,000 words 50 % (2 hours). This subject has the following hurdle requirements: Regular participation in tutorials is required with a minimum of 75% attendance. All pieces of written work must be submitted to pass this subject. Assessment submitted late without an approved extension will be penalised at 10% per day and in-class tasks missed without approval will not be marked.
