It contains elements related to practical language acquisition and the study of Spanish and Latin American culture through film and text.

Assessment:	Continuous aural, oral and written assessment 50% (2,000 words). final written examination of 2,000 words 50 % (2 hours). This subject has the following hurdle requirements: Regular participation in tutorials is required with a minimum of 75% attendance. All pieces of written work must be submitted to pass this subject. Assessment submitted late without an approved extension will be penalised at 10% per day and in-class tasks missed without approval will not be marked.
