It comprises:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> # two first year subjects: Anthropology Studying Human Diversity, and an Arts Foundation Subject (../view/current/%21B-ARTS-SPC%2B1001) ; and # three second/third year level subjects selected from the core subjects list; and # three second/third year level subjects from either the core or optional lists. <p>Students who commenced their degree before 2007 will need to complete 112.5 points toward this major in order to complete the major.
